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Prompts for Reflection

It is easy to pass judgement from one era on to another.

But is there a word from the Lord for us here?

One word we may receive is that no one person, or group has a monopoly on being loved and welcomed by the Creator God.



God is greater than all our divisions and certainly greater than all our religions. At its best, any great religious tradition opens a path to the divine. But it is one path.

Following from this we need not be intimidated when anyone presumes to speak in the name of God, whether this be the father of Jesus Christ, or Yahweh, or Allah. We all have access to God when we come honestly through our spiritual tradition.

We each also have a moral obligation to call evil, evil, in whatever form we confront it. We need not be intimidated.

Even more challenging, we are all called to love and care. These are not nice sentiments. Love and care can make the difference between liberation and enslavement, life and death. Certainly, the way of violence leads exactly there, to violence. It is a trap and always has been. It is basic instinct to react to violence with violence, but you can never escape. It is only repentance, forgiveness, and reconciliation, that can spring the trap.
