

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## **Prompts for Reflection**

The Bible is into journeys. There are several significant ones throughout the Testaments. There is the overarching story of salvation which begins with our creation, moves to our fall, and ends with our redemption. There is the call to Abraham which begins in Ur of the Chaldeans and ends in the land of Canaan. There is of course the Exodus journey of the people of Israel from Egypt, through the wilderness of Sinia into the Promised Land. This is followed by the fall of the two kingdoms leading to the forced journey of the people of Israel into Babylonian exile. Exile is followed by return. The Hebrew scriptures are ringed by these journeys as psalmists, kings and prophets are caught up in them, trying to make sense of their God, their nation and themselves. They have formed us too, these stories, especially if we have been raised with them since childhood.
