# **Prompts for Reflection**

We wish there was no occasion in life for which to lament. But lament we do. It is an ancient practice. In view of recent events in Israel-Palestine, what I hope may be enabled through the practice of lament is

Word of the Day:

I will complain, yet praise, I will bewail, approve, And all my sour-sweet days I will lament and love.

(George Herbert (1593-1633) from "Bitter-sweet"

that our perplexity and our grief may be brought out of our own brooding and in worship placed at the foot of the cross—the burden shared, but also laid down. There are things which are too much for us to bear alone.

This is what the psalms do for us over and again. Especially the communal psalms of lament which take up a third of the psalter.

In reading scripture together, reflecting upon it, praying communally—we place these burdens where they belong—at the foot of the cross. There are other ways to cope with reports and images of violence, and that is to shut them off. And some do this. Literally shut off the news. At times this may be necessary to collect oneself and to

recover. But I don' think we can finally ignore or deny the suffering, as painful as it may be to acknowledge. Rather, we can bring it to God in honest, vulnerable prayer together with the gathered community of God's people.
