
#### \* HYMN - The Church's One Foundation



# **Prompts for Reflection**

Any thing and many things can become idols for us. There are the obvious ones like political ideologies. They have been present for as long as human beings have lived together. In our time they are legion, ideologies on the left and on the right. So much conversation has degenerated into shouting



matches, speaking past and over each other. Each side trying to score talking points and winning the publicity war.

In the face of this the Bible insists that God alone is judge, and all is judged under the divine gaze, meaning there is one ultimate, and all the rest are penultimate, including corporations, governments, religions—including the Christian religion—all stand under a greater judgment.

The Protestant Reformation understood this profound truth, which it recognized as arising from the first two commandments:

I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me.
