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



Prompts for Reflection

Word of the Day:

I have learned to be content with whatever I have. I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me.

(Philippians 4: 11-13).

In the passage above (Philippians 4:11-13), Paul is writing about how he has managed to find contentment amid hard times and amid good times. He says nothing about overcoming the hard times. He is still having a hard time! He is writing as a prisoner



in a prison, and it is not looking good. Nor is contentment akin to passive acceptance for Paul. Rather, contentment is the preliminary ground for focused energy on one thing—the proclamation of the gospel. The gospel, the good news which untangles us from self-preoccupation, concern for getting ahead, preoccupation for what is good for me, even preoccupation over my rights! The good news is my restoration of relationship with God by God! And so, I have freedom and power to love, and God knows the world needs love because the world has forgotten that it is loved. Because I am loved into life eternal, I can live love, mediate peace, bind wounds, lift the broken hearted, and live with a hope which transcends all that I can do. This is the gospel! And because Paul is content in all circumstances, he can proclaim the gospel.
