### Five Finger Prayer -

In preparation for our intergenerational worship, the Faith Finders children learned a five-finger prayer for The Greatest Commandment. We had fun playing around with the challenge of holding up and moving one finger at a time. The children took turns leading these memory verses. All are invited to try this at home and during the worship service on Sunday.

Hold up your hand with fingers spread wide. Using five fingers, review and memorize Jesus' message. Wiggle each finger as you say the verse.

Thumb: Love the Lord your God First finger: with all your heart Second finger: with all your soul Third finger: and with all your mind.

Pinky finger: Love your neighbour as you love yourself.
