




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Word of the Day:

Prompts for Reflection



Once upon a time, a baby was born in a nondescript backwater, a scene we will soon see replayed in Nativity Plays many of which will be 'celebrations of imperfection' (Frank Cottrell Boyce). That baby boy grew up amidst turmoil and tribulation, and as a young man on trial for his life he was asked 'what is truth?' The young man had answered that question many times over. That day he does not answer. for the answer is life, a life lived. A life lived transparently. Likely, Pilate had never met one who shows up, embodying a purity of action, without contradiction or equivocation—so, that day, Pilate washed his hands.
