






Prompts for Reflection



One function of the 'unveiling' or Revelation of John is to lift our sight, to give us a different point of view. To help us believe in alternatives, not human-made alternatives, but ones which are beyond our power to conceive or to effect. We can be so locked-in to the present,

whether its humdrumness or its horror, that we cannot vision alternatives. John wanted his people, his suffering brothers and sisters, to behold an alternative vision which he receives from transcendence, from heaven.

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying,

'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!'
And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.'
