


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## Word of the day

*Nathan said to David, 'You are the man! (2 Samuel 12: 7)* 

## **Prompts for Reflection**



Hearing the parable of the rich man who takes a poor man's one and only ewe lamb David the King is incensed at the injustice, but just so, he condemns himself. Nathan the prophet declares to his King: "You are the man." Despite the abundance he has been given, David continues to covet and to take. And so, the violence David has enacted on his subjects will now be visited upon his household. But the consequences of David's actions will be borne most directly by the child born to Bathsheba and to him. The child will die, even while David will live.

We may be led to despair; can sin be repented of? atoned for? forgiven? The Desert Fathers and Mothers who were especially attuned to the devastating consequences of sin speak of hope springing eternal so long as there is repentance. In the words of St. Peter of Damaskos (12th century): "Should we fall, we should not despair and so estrange ourselves from the Lord's love," "let us always be ready to make a new start. If you fall, rise up. If you fall again, rise up again."
