



In this 1944 painting by the German-born artist Georg Grosz, Cain sits exhausted, dejected, and anxious as to what will happen next. Though it is hard to make out in grey-scale, or even in the dark coloured original, his brother, Abel, lies at his right, while his blood has already formed into a jumble of skeletons surging at Cain's feet. Grosz's painting, titled Cain, or Hitler in Hell, is a commentary on the aftermath of willed destruction laying waste people and land, a sad commentary too often replayed in our history as well as today's headlines.
