

#### Word of the Day:

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them (1 John 4:16b).

As we know the origin of Mother's Day is not from the greeting card companies.
Rather it originates from brave and wise mothers who advocated for an end to the killing, the wars, and the blood feuds, which claimed their sons' souls and lives.



The testament to this in the modern period is the poem penned by Julia Ward Howe in September 1870, five years after the end of the American Civil War:

# Arise, then, women of this day!

Arise, all women who have hearts, Whether our baptism be of water or of tears! Say firmly: "We will not have great questions decided by irrelevant agencies, Our husbands will not come to us, reeking with carnage, for caresses and applause. Our sons shall not be taken from us to unlearn All that we have been able to teach them of charity, mercy and patience. We, the women of one country, will be too tender of those of another country To allow our sons to be trained to injure theirs."

From the bosom of the devastated Earth a voice goes up with our own.

It says: "Disarm!

These bold words do not come bordered by flowers set in a greeting card, but they still speak to our time.
