
* HYMN - Praise, My Soul, The King of Heaven

Erik Kessels The installation 24hrs in Photos is presented as a mountain of photographs amassed in bulk. This device randomly materialises the number of files downloaded in a single day and posted on Flickr, a website for sharing photos.

In a time of oversharing, just because we can, we may be stopped short by the ancient wisdom, which is a statement of fact—we all die. But facts by themselves may not give meaning. Meaning is what we feed on. We all die, and yet most of us wish to linger, if nowhere else than in the hearts and minds, in the love and the memories, of those with whom we were most intimate, those with whom we lived, whom we loved and who loved us back.

Before we fast-forward to the revelation of Eternal Life vouchsafed to us in the Christian Scriptures, it is good to meditate long and hard on the truth that we will die. This is a hard stop.
