





Dear Congregation,


In the dead of winter, we are making an appeal for 5 Air Conditioning Units! The total cost is \$50,000. This Spring, they will be installed in the Boardroom, the Vestry, the Nursery and the Alan room.

This need results from the reconfiguration of our interior space to welcome new tenants in the nursery, as well as in the 3rd floor classrooms. These rentals will now provide us with regular income which enables us to offer sacred space for worship, a safe gathering place for the community, and of course concert space for Music@Central and music space for choirs and concerts in the city of Hamilton.

Prompts for Reflection



Jesus' first congregation in Nazareth was not prepared to have these words of Scripture fulfilled in their hearing—and neither do we.

The church cannot exist for itself. We gather as a church to receive God's mercy and grace, so that we can then go out and be merciful in turn. This is

why we support this place. Not as an end in itself but such that it can be an opening for heaven to touch the earth. This is why, if we are honest, we cannot think of spirituality and the church as a leisure time activity, something we can do on a weekend, or on a three-day retreat.
