PRELUDE

WELCOME and INTRODUCTION TO THE SERVICE

The service is known as the "Service of The Nails." It is a series of readings, responses, and silent reflection and prayer designed to help us enter more deeply into the meaning of Good Friday. Everyone is requested to take a nail from the basket, if they do not have one yet, and to keep it with them.

Let us now prepare to worship our God.....

THE APPROACH

CALL TO WORSHIP Isaiah 52:13-15

Leader: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you

Leader: See, my servant shall prosper; he shall be exalted and lifted up, and

shall be very high. Just as there were many who were astonished at him --so marred was his appearance, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of mortals-- so he shall startle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which had not been told them

they shall see, and that which they had not heard they shall

contemplate.

* HYMN - Oh Come and Mourn With Me Awhile

1. Oh come and mourn with me awhile; oh come ye to the Saviour's side; oh come, together let us mourn; Jesus, our Lord, is crucified.

2. Have we no tears to shed for him, while soldiers scoff and foes deride? Ah! look how patiently he hangs: Jesus, our Lord, is crucified.

3. Seven times he spoke, seven words of love, and all three hours his silence cried, 'Forgive: they know not what they do.' Jesus, our Lord, is crucified.

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4. O love of God! O human sin! In this dread act your strength is tried, and victory remains with love: for Christ, our Lord, is crucified.

PRAYER OF APPROACH

Leader: Let us pray.

People: O merciful God, you did not spare your only Son, but offered him up for us

all, that he might bear our sins upon the cross. Grant that we might so examine ourselves that we realize our own sinfulness, so great as to spiritually crucify him anew. Help us to recognize those nails which we drive into his cross today, and transform us into more faithful disciples in

his name. Amen.

THE NAILS OF THE CROSS

THE NAIL OF PRIDE Mark 12:38-40

Meditation and Prayer (beginning with silence)

Leader: O God - help us consider our own pride and where it leads.

People: O God - do not let us deceive ourselves.

Our pride hurts us and creates walls between us and others.

Leader: O God, we know too that our pride hurts you.

THE NAIL OF BETRAYAL

Matthew 26:47-56

Meditation and Prayer (beginning with silence)

Leader: O God - help us consider how we betray others, how we abandon

them in their time of need, how we think of ourselves first.

People: O God - do not let us deceive ourselves.

Our acts of betrayal hurt us and create walls between us and others.

Leader: O God, we know too that our betrayal hurts you.

THE NAIL OF ENVY Matthew 20:20-28

Meditation and Prayer (beginning with silence)

Leader: O God - help us consider how we envy others, how we desire more

than we receive and seek to influence and rule over others.

People: O God - do not let us deceive ourselves.

Our envy hurts us and creates walls between us and others.

Leader: O God, we know too that our envy hurts you.

THE NAIL OF INDECISION

Matthew 27:20-24

Meditation and Prayer (beginning with silence)

Leader: O God - help us consider how we waver, how we seek to avoid

responsibility and to blame others for our actions.

People: O God - do not let us deceive ourselves.

Our indecision hurts us and creates walls between us and others.

Leader: O God, we know too that our indecision hurts you.

THE NAIL OF CRUELTY

Matthew 27:27-31, 39-42, 45-48

Meditation and Prayer (beginning with silence)

Leader: O God - help us consider how we are cruel to others, how we malign

and slander others and add to the evil that comes upon them.

People: O God - do not let us deceive ourselves.

Our cruelty hurts us and creates walls between us and others.

Leader: O God, we know too that our cruelty hurts you.

THE NAIL OF HATRED

Luke 6:22, 32-35

* HYMN - Man Of Sorrows

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- 1. Man of sorrows, wondrous name for the Son of God who came ruined sinners to reclaim: Hallelujah! Gracious Saviour!
- 2. Bearing shame and scoffing rude, in my place condemned he stood, sealed my pardon with his blood: Hallelujah! Loving Saviour!
- 3. Guilty, helpless, lost were we; spotless Lamb of God was he; full atonement can it be? Hallelujah! Blessed Saviour!

- 4. Lifted up he was to die, 'It is finished' was his cry, now in heaven exalted high: Hallelujah! Mighty Saviour!
- 5. When Christ comes, our glorious King, all the ransomed home to bring, then anew this song we'll sing: Hallelujah! Wondrous Saviour!

People: O God - do not let us deceive ourselves.

Our hatred hurts us and creates walls between us and others.

Leader: O God, we know too that our hatred hurts you.

THE RESPONSE

ACT OF CONFESSION Isaiah 53:4-6

Leader: Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows, yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God and afflicted.

People: He was wounded for our transgressions and he was bruised for our iniquities. Upon him was the chastisement that made us whole.

Leader: All we like sheep have gone astray; each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid upon him the iniquity of us all.

THE PROMISE OF MERCY

Isaiah 53:7-13

Leader: He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

People: By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people.

Leader: They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

People: Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper.

Leader: Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge.

People: The righteous one, God's servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.

Leader: Therefore, I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Leader: Lord God, you have given us everything.

Leader: Be pleased, O God, in the name of Jesus, to accept all that we offer at this time. Look upon the intentions of our hearts. Hear our prayers and in you love answer. Lord we each come forward to bring to you our concerns, our hopes, our sins, here represented by the nail that we lay at the foot of the cross......

..... (silent prayer)

Leader: We ask all these things through him who taught us to pray to you, saying:

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name.

Thy Kingdom come.
Thy will be done on earth,
As it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive those
who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
But deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,
For ever and ever. Amen

* HYMN - O Sacred Head, Sore Wounded

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

No matter who you are, how you identify, whom you love, or where you are on life's journey: know you are welcome here, and you are loved by God.




